



In a sermon Fr John gave earlier this fall, which can be read or watched at saintmatthiasoakdale.com/giving-sermon, he emphasized the good news that the amount any of us give to the Church has no impact on God's heart toward us or our standing with Him. While local churches (like our own) rely entirely on parishioner giving for their survival, and giving can be spiritually beneficial in many ways, God invites us to give voluntarily out of love for Him and others as we learn to trust in His provision for what we need.

Like many parishes in the Anglican tradition. we hold an Annual Stewardship Drive each fall to assist our Vestry in planning our budget for the upcoming year. This year's drive is themed "Home Improvement" and will run from October 29 through November 26. This narrative budget booklet is meant to inform parishioners of our anticipated operating costs for running the parish in 2024 along with some outstanding property improvement & deferred maintenance projects the Vestry would like to begin addressing in 2024. The results of the Stewardship Drive will help the Vestry discern whether we will be able to complete some of these projects in 2024 or just continue saving toward their future completion. To that end, we invite parishioners to read this information and prayerfully consider pledging to give financially in 2024, not under compulsion, but out of love for God and others.

Background on Building Purchase & Property Improvement

In 2016, our Parish lost ownership of our buildings on the corner of First Avenue and F Street as a result of our Diocese's disaffiliation from the Episcopal Church in 2008. But God provided a way for us to purchase these buildings back from the Episcopal Church in 2022 for \$765,000. This purchase included a (25 year) \$500,000 loan, which increased our operating budget, and a \$265,000 down payment, which left our savings fairly lean.

However, in the year and a half since, the Vestry authorized the deferred maintenance projects, as well as property upgrades deemed necessary for facilitating ministry. These are listed below, along with a few particular projects that were gifted by parishioners. Essentially all of these costs have ended up being off-set by parishioner gifts for property improvement.

Stewardship Drive Goals for 2024

As we plan for 2024, the Vestry has identified four projects as the most pressing needs for stewarding our buildings. We hope to use any excess funds given in 2023, as well as any additional funds pledged for 2024, to complete some or all of these projects in the next year.

^ These prices reflect bids received in the past six months. However, actual costs are subject to change, particularly due to volatile pricing of material. If giving in the final three months of 2023 matches our projections, we expect to net approximately \$22,000 by the end of the year. In 2024, we do anticipate some increased expenses, particularly in regard to insurance; however, we begin this Stewardship Drive optimistic that parishioner giving will cover our projected operating budget expenses of \$236,518 (see page 7 for more details). This Stewardship Drive will help us project how much we can expect to receive in excess of our operating budget, which can be added to funds we net in 2023 to cover some or all of the four projects listed on the previous page.

So our encouragement to you during this pledge drive is to take a full (and prayerful) measure of the financial realities of your situation and pledge to give in the amount that you believe God is calling you to.

How can I make a pledge?
