## **Advent wreath**

The Advent wreath symbolizes the Christian journey through Advent. It can be made of fresh greenery, fake greenery, or no greenery and simply placing the candles in a circle. There are five candles, traditionally, three purple, one pink, and a white candle in the center. The candles can be real or battery, whatever works best for you.

Christians use the Advent candles to celebrate this period with one lit every Sunday of advent, so that during the last week of advent all the candles are lit. The last candle, the central candle, represents Christ and is lit on Christmas day. You may remember seeing the advent wreath hanging near the altar at church each advent season.



Advent Prayers (BCP pages 598-599)

Advent Week 1: Purple candle themed for HOPE

Hope is like a light shining in a dark place. As we look at the light of this candle, we celebrate the hope we have in Jesus Christ.

Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness, and put on the armor of light, now in the time of this mortal life in which your Son Jesus Christ came to visit us in great humility; that in the day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge both the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

Advent Week 2: Two purple candles, the candle from Advent wk 1 and now another themed for PEACE

Peace is like a light comforting and protecting us in a dark place. As we look at the light of this candle, we celebrate the peace we find in Jesus Christ.

Blessed Lord, who caused all Holy Scriptures to be written for our learning: Grant us so to hear them, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them, that by patience and the comfort of your Holy Word we may embrace and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life, which you have given us in our Savior Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen. Advent Week 3: Two purple candles, and now the Rose pink candle themed for JOY

Joy keeps the darkness at bay. As we look at the light of this candle, we celebrate the joy we find in Jesus Christ.

Oh Lord Jesus Christ, you sent your messengers the prophets to preach repentance and prepare the way for our salvation: Grant that the ministers and stewards of your mysteries may likewise make ready your way, by turning the hearts of the disobedient toward the wisdom of the just, that at your second coming to judge the world, we may be found a people acceptable in your sight; for with the Father and the Holy Spirit you live and reign, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

Advent Week 4: Light the two purple candles, the Rose pink candle and now the purple candle of LOVE

We love because He first loved us. As we look at this candle, we celebrate the love we have in Christ.

Stir up your power, O Lord, and with great might come among us; and as we are sorely hindered by our sins from running the race that is set before us, let your bountiful grace and mercy speedily help and deliver us; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, be honor and glory, now and for ever. Amen.

Christmas Day: All candles are lit, including the white candle in the middle

The fifth candle represents the birth of Christ. The flame of this candle reminds us that He is the light of the world and that if we follow him, we will never walk in darkness, but will have the true light of life.

Almighty God, you have given your only- begotten Son to take our nature upon him, and to be born (this day) of a pure virgin: Grant that we, who have been born again and made your children by adoption and grace, may daily be renewed by your Holy Spirit; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom with you and the same Spirit be honor and glory, now and for ever. Amen.
